Did you know?

- More than 30 states (not including Louisiana) have laws preventing environmental hazards at schools.
- There is a cycle of building a school on a toxic waste dump every 30 to 40 years in New Orleans.
- The Booker T. Washington High School was built on the Clio Street/Silver City Dump in the 1940s.
- The Moton Elementary School was built on the Agriculture Street Dump in the 1980s.
- The Recovery School District plans to continue this cycle into the 21st Century with a plan to close the Walter L. Cohen High School building and construct a new school where the Booker T. Washington High School was built on the Clio Street/Silver City Dump.
